# FOOD PANTRY VOLUNTEERS

February 27, 2021

Tirey J. Ford Post 21 celebrated its 1 year anniversary of operating its monthly food pantry. Over the last year the Post has provided food for Veterans in need of a helping hand. Over the last year the pantry has served 374 households totaling 916 individuals, including 413 adults, 180 children, and 323 elderly. The Post has received 3452 pounds of food from Harvesters. That figure alone provided 2,877 meals. The pantry has also received and continues to receive donations from our members and members of our community. The food pantry is open the last Saturday of every month. The hours of operation are 8:30-10:30 am. At our October 2019 Post meeting we had a guest speaker from Heroes Care talk to the Post about the Food Pantry closing at the Ozark National Guard Armory due to security restrictions. Heroes Care was looking for a place to reestablish the food pantry. It was an easy decision to have the pantry here at the post, since the pantry serves Veterans and their families, Active-duty members, National Guard and Reserve and their families.

The food pantry officially opened in February 2020. The months following the grand opening were totally unexpected and unprecedented. Covid-19 restrictions were in place and the need for food increased. The Post was able to maintain and even increase the supply of goods needed for the pantry by donations from Post Members and members of the community and the use of Harvesters. The staff working the pantry consists totally of volunteers. Their commitment has insured a smooth operation of the pantry. Even during the pandemic, the pantry has had volunteer assistance from Midwest Poppies for Patriots. They have been a great asset to the pantry, and they continue to be of help today.

Tirey J. Ford Post 21 is committed to continue the pantry as long as there is a need in the community. Donations of non-perishable items are always accepted.

We will need plenty of volunteers to make this event memorable for our unit and the National President. Just a heads up, more information to follow on these two items. Tom Tanner has been contacted by the VA with plans to set up Covid Vaccine opportunities at the post. The Community Blood Bank is also working to schedule blood banks at the post. I feel both of these steps will be great for the community and our post. If there are volunteer needs once these events are scheduled I will let you know.
