VA Medical Marijuana Update 59
H.R.1151/S.445 | Veterans Medical Marijuana Safe Harbor Act

Sen. Brian Schatz (D-HI) and Rep. Barbara Lee (D-CA) reintroduced legislation to let Veterans Affairs doctors prescribe medical marijuana in the 33 states where it's legal. The bill also would direct VA to research how medical marijuana might help manage chronic pain and reduce opioid misuse. "There is now abundant evidence that, where medical marijuana is available, opioid abuse goes down," Schatz previously told POLITICO's Sarah Overmohle.

"When I asked the VA administrator about that question, I was expecting resistance but I got the opposite — he agreed and believed that it was worth further study." The bill has a chance to pass Congress: The Veterans Medical Marijuana Safe Harbor Act, (116) / H.R. 1151 (116), is also backed by numerous veterans organizations and pain groups. "It will be difficult for even the most ardent cannabis opponents to deny veterans access to cannabis, especially considering worries about opioid addiction," Cowen analyst Vivien Azer wrote in a note to investors late last year.

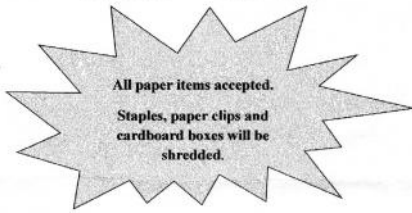

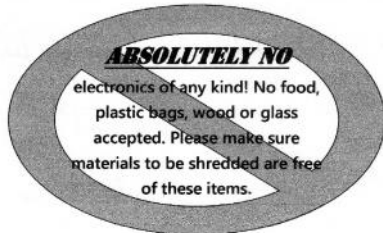
