**67 Years Later Tirey J. Ford Post 21
Honors Daughter of WW II Veteran**

Lana (Mardis) Boggs recently discovered that her father, John E Mardis, a WWII Veteran, never received Military Honors after his tragic death in September 1948. John lost his life in a traffic accident involving a drunk driver when his daughter was only a year old.

John E. Mardis was a multiple-spindle drill press operator at the Aircraft Accessories Incorporated, Kansas City Kansas and also operated milling machines. John enlisted in the Army August 9, 1944 at Fort Leavenworth Kansas. As he advanced through the ranks, John was a rifleman, Ammunition Bearer, Section Leader, and Platoon NCO. He served as a Technical Sergeant in Company B, 32nd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division US Army during WWII. John was in the Asia Pacific Theater of Operations twelve months, where he supervised a Platoon of Riflemen. While there, he took part in, and survived the Battle of Ryukyu Islands of Okinawa. That was one of the bloodiest conflicts in the Pacific Theatre. John was discharged February 17, 1946 at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. He was awarded the Combat Infantry Badge, the Bronze Star and the Good Conduct Medal upon his discharge from the US Army. John then served his community as a City Police Officer of Greencastle, Missouri for at least one year. His last job was as a Decorator for the Chicago Decorating Company. That's when that fatal accident cut short his life of thirty years, in Gary, Indiana.

His daughter, Lana, contacted Tirey J Ford American Legion Post 21 in Independence, Missouri and requested support in giving John the military Honors he had not received, since John had been a WWII Veteran. The Post coordinated a special presentation on November 16, 2015, of an American Flag which had flown over the Missouri Capital building. John's daughter, Lana, received the special American Flag with full Military Honors. John's granddaughter and her husband were also present. Participating in the presentation was American Legion Post Commander Phil Greco, Post Adjutant Tom Tanner, Post Chaplain Kerry Boardman and the honor funeral team from MONG, VFW 1738 Honor Team. Several members from the American Legion, SAL and Auxiliary also attended the ceremony.
