
The 1st Vice Commander removed the POW/MIA flag from the empty chair.


Greetings SAL Members both old and new,

My Legion Story, Bob Ford, Commander

Post 21 is the first and only American Legion Post that I have been a member of. My eligibility comes from serving in the United States Navy from 1970 to 1974. I enlisted during Christmas Break my senior year in High School and left for Boot Camp at Great Lakes 14 days following graduation. After completing basic training, I remained at Great Lakes for 8 weeks of Electricity/Electronics School. Following that I was sent to Key West (rough duty) for an Ocean Systems Maintenance Course. While there I became interested in and applied for Underwater Swimmers (Scuba). I was then sent to Adak Alaska for my first permanent duty station. After a year and a couple of TAD deployments I was transferred to San Nicolas Island off the coast of California. I packed up my bride and moved to Oxnard California. I was only home 7-9 days a month with the bulk of the time being spent on the island. Then In May, 1974 I was discharged, and we moved back to Independence.

After several years of raising a family, serving my church as an Orthodox priest I was looking for something else. I checked out the American Legion and filled out an application on-line. I printed it off and stopped by the post and talked to the Adjutant Ed Murray. He welcomed me with open arms and gave me a tour of the building. I was introduced to the Commander who was Mike Sweeney at the time. I have now been a member for around 10 years. 7 of those 10 years I have held an officer position either in the Riders or Post with 3 of those years as Commander. With the support of my bride Betty, we spend many hours a week there volunteering. Of course, I do administrative tasks, as well as kitchen duties, inventory stocking and I am the sole editor of the post newsletter. Betty is right there with me. You can always see her taking orders for post meals and she is the administrator of our POS system. Starting July 21st, 2023, I will move into the Adjutants Office. I look forward to the new challenge.





We are in need of a mower for the summer. SAL member Walt Seigler has tire-


