VA Cemeteries Update 14

Funding Bill's Confederate Flag Ban Removed

A measure to bar confederate flags from cemeteries run by the Department of Veterans Affairs was removed from legislation passed by the House early 23 JUN. The flag ban was added to the VA funding bill in May by a vote of 265-159, with most Republicans voting against the ban. But Speaker Paul Ryan (R-Wis.) and Majority Leader Kevin McCarthy (R-Calif.) both supported the measure. Ryan was commended for allowing a vote on the controversial measure, but has since limited what amendments can be offered on the floor. In negotiations to reconcile the House funding measure with the Senate bill, the confederate flag provision was dropped. The bill passed the House 239-171. Of the eight House Republicans Ryan appointed to the conference committee that ultimately stripped the measure, four had voted against the ban on the floor. 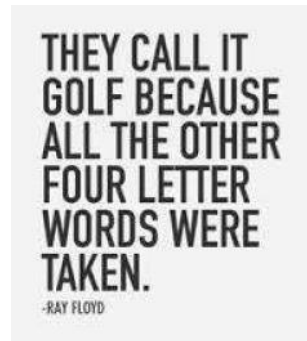
The number one task will be controlling our cash flow, controlling our inventory. Many tough decision will be made and changes will come from The House Committee, Executive Committee and our general membership.

90th Anniversary of VA Social Work

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) proudly celebrates VA Social Work: 90 Years of Excellence.

On June 16, 1926, Brigadier General Frank T. Hines, Director, U.S. Veterans Bureau, issued General Order No. 351 establishing a Social Work Department in VA Central Office. In its inaugural year, 36 new positions were authorized for VA social workers. Today, there are 12,000 social workers who provide professional support and services to Veterans throughout various mediums in VA, to include treatment responsibilities in all patient care areas.

The Office of Care Management and Social Work Services supports and advances the mission of VA by providing comprehensive psychosocial support services to Veterans, their families, and caregivers. These services include assessment, crisis intervention, high-risk screening, discharge planning, case management, advocacy, education, supportive counseling, psychotherapy, resource referrals, research, program development, and resource acquisition.

Professional social workers and trainees provide care in all settings across the Veterans Health Administration's continuum of care, including inpatient, outpatient, residential, and community-based care settings. Social workers are key interdisciplinary team members in mission-critical, specialty care program areas including Primary Care, Geriatrics and Extended Care, Intimate Partner Violence Assistance, Caregiver Support, Fisher House, Transition and Care Management, Homeless, Telehealth, and Mental Health. Paper Statements

Would you Pay to Continue Receiving them?

Most consumers — 54 percent — still receive a paper statement for a credit card or checking account, according to a new CreditCards.com survey of 1,000 U.S. adults. Among consumers who prefer paper, nearly half are so attached that they would choose to continue receiving paper statements even if they were charged extra for them. Reasons commonly cited by people who prefer paper statements include:

- * They like to keep paper for their records.
- * They like to pay bills by check, and mailed statements provide the bill and the envelope.
- * The paper serves as a reminder the bill has to be paid.
- * They're comfortable with paper.

Reasons commonly cited by people who prefer digital statements include:

- * They can access them anywhere.
- * It's environmentally friendly to save paper.
- * You can pay bills faster.
- * They're comfortable being online.

CreditCards.com's survey found that age appears to affect a person's preference, with the youngest consumers polled (ages 18 to 25) being six times more likely to prefer digital over paper statements compared with the oldest consumers polled (ages 71 and older). Some consumers choose both forms of statements:

- * 55 percent of consumers who receive their checking and debit card account statements electronically also receive paper copies.
- * 44 percent of consumers who receive credit card statements electronically also receive paper statements.

A recent report from the National Consumer Law Center urges that paper statements should be available for free and that customers who prefer paper should not be steered into electronic billing by default. Ever Wonder?????

Ever wonder what happened to the flags collected at the post for retirement. Just recently post member Rich Carroll was approached by Post Adjutant Tom Tanner asking if there was any thought to the proper disposal of these collected flags. A plan began to take shape and Rich took possession of the 15-20 bags of flags collected over the year. Believing it to be inappropriate to surrender the flags in the plastic bags they were stored in, Rich sought out a Boy Scout Troup to properly fold and place the flags in suitable boxes for the retirement ceremony. Boy Scout Troup 178 from Nativity of Mary Catholic Church and Scout Master David Vest agreed to fold each and every flag regardless of its size. The number estimated at 1000 to 1500 flags were folded and placed in boxes donated by U-Haul on Noland Road. The retirement Ceremony took place on June 14th (Flag Day) at the Missouri Korean War Memorial Persing and Main downtown Kansas City. The post Adjutant volunteered the Riders to serve as an escort for the flag vehicle on that day. So with the appropriate Pomp and Circumstance the flags were delivered to the ceremony site and surrendered to a Scout Master who will, under ceremonial protocol at Camp Nash, burn the flags. The ashes will be spread on the grounds at Camp Nash making it, in their opinion, hallowed ground. The flag grommets will be recovered and except for a requested number which will be presented to the individual escort riders as well as one for each Scout, the collected grommets will be placed in a cremation urn and delivered to Leavenworth National Cemetery for burial in the national cemetery. The Adjutant has requested he be made aware of the burial schedule and it is believed that the riders will be asked to escort the urn to Leavenworth for the interment services.
