HOW CAN I GET THE COVID VACCINATION AT OUR VA?

- 1. You Must be registered with the VA for medical care.
- 2. You Must be in the age range or have other reasons to be in the current priority group. Contact your PC if you have medical concerns.
- 3. Call (816) 922-2619 to schedule both shots. (Do not give up if put on hold!)
- 4. As of the 1st wk of Feb 2021, priority was Age 65 & older.
- 5. If you receive an automated call from (816) 861-4700, answer it and follow instructions! This is the main phone # of our VA Medical Center.
- 6. If you have tested positive, they want you to wait 90 days before taking the vaccine, especially if you received monoclonal antibodies when treated for COVID-19.

The VA Medical Center on Linwood has already administered 12,000 doses, and 3,000 more were just received as of our monthly meeting on Feb 4th, 2021. This information was gathered from the VA by Sylvia Tanner.

Over the last year the food pantry has received additional assistance from Harvesters in helping us to provide food assistance to those in need of a hand up. The following is what Harvesters has provided (note the number of households and individuals comes from my report to Harvesters).

Total Households Served: 374
Total Individuals: 916
Adults: 413
Children: 180

Elderly: 323

Total Pounds of food provided to the pantry: 3452.

Total Meals Provided: 2877.

In 2020 we acquired 3452 pounds of food and household goods from Harvesters valued at \$5592.24.
