Greetings Fellow Riders, Legionnaires, Auxiliary, and SAL.



By the time you read this, we will have moved into our Fall season. Many of us, especially me, welcome the cooler weather. The summer heat took it's toll on me this year. I guess it is signs of getting old(er).

Our busy schedule has not let up any. We continue to have multiple events every week. From funerals to ceremonies to membership drives and yes, meals at the post and other locations we keep plenty busy. As I sit here writing this today, we have 2 events scheduled and it's raining. We had 2 events yesterday in the heat and 2 events per day are scheduled for the next two days. That's eight events in 4 days! This week we had ceremonies, flag presentation, escorts, funeral, KCVA visit, and a couple of meals supporting the post. As of now we are free to enjoy Chiefs tailgating at the post but it's still early so that could change.

Here are the totals for the Legacy Fund:

National Legacy Fund donations totaled \$1,155,363.00

We gave the second largest donation-up from #3 last year.

The amount of the Missouri donation was \$90,834

Dept. of Minnesota was the largest donation with \$148,367

80 bikes and 125 riders stopped at 1 veterans cemetery, 1 city cemetery, 1 VFW post and 10 American legion posts; rode 81,250 miles on the ride itself over a span of 3 days with 0 accidents and only 1 bike with electrical issues.

I want to thank those of you who stepped up to fill some of the volunteer positions that I am trying to fill. Thank you Leslie Tuttle for coordinating the Tuesday night Bingo 50/50 and to Larry Harrison for filling a Road Captain position.

Our current Road crew consist of Head Road Captain Doug Vetter, Road Captain Larry Harrison, Tailgunners David Cary and Dan Orr. I have room for one more Road Captain so come and talk to me.

Dan Orr suggested that we have a new position of Safety Officer. I think this is a good idea. This position will be in charge of training and enforcing safe riding (in conjunction with the Road Crew). I would expect a short 5 minute Safety presentation at each riders meeting and multiple opportunities to present a group riding seminar to acquaint new riders and remind seasoned riders in the way we as Legion Riders ride.

Free Flu Shots: From now through March 31, 2017, all veterans enrolled in the VA health care system can receive free flu shots at any Walgreens or Duane Reade pharmacy. The joint outreach health initiative is designed to help serve veterans closer to where they reside. Veterans must bring their VA identification cards with them, as well as another photo ID, and complete a short four-question application, which will be used to automatically update their VA Electronic Health Records. No appointments are necessary.

The new Legion year has begun and membership renewals are coming in fast and furious. The Post is at 60.60% of the goal as set by National. That gives us approx. 983 members renewed for the new year. We have a long way to go to reach 100% of our goal before the end of the Legion year. If you have not renewed your membership yet, please do so.
